



### **Active participation of the Department of Geography of the Federal College of Education Kano - Nigeria**

On 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2011 a field trip of level 200 NCE students to Bauchi State in the northeastern part of Nigeria was organized. The students experienced the impact of climate change on the hydrology of the river Dindima. Lectures were given in the field and interaction with the local community and their perception on climate change took place.

On 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2011 secondary school students were introduced into the concept of climate change for the first time in their life:

1. What is climate change?
2. What are consequences of climate change?
3. Why are we concerned about climate change?
4. How do we all contribute to climate change?

Finally, a club named Climate Change Peer Educators Club (CCPEC) was inaugurated. The club comprises 20 male and female members. The school students performed a drama, a cultural dance and songs on the impact of climate change in Africa. Altogether the African Climate Teach-In Day was a great success at the Federal College of Education Kano in Nigeria!
